Tracking a Storm

Hurricane season is upon us here in Florida, and while we can't stop Mother Nature from delivering us heavy rains, high winds and lightening during this season, we can prepare for potential storms to ensure the safety of all along SunRail's corridor. Fortunately, the team at SunRail has a Hurricane Preparedness Plan with instructions for all SunRail departments when storms threaten.

Preparations include: securing the engines and passenger cars in the SunRail yard in Sanford, the removal of safety arms over 28 ft. high from grade-crossings, securing signals and shutting down the electronic fare equipment. Preparations begin as a storm approaches and the sustained winds are expected to reach 39 mph or the rails begin to flood. At times, it may be necessary to suspend operations before a storm's arrival, if conditions are expected to become severe, so that our team can take the necessary precautions.

Ahead of these necessary preparations, SunRail will keep passengers informed and provide the public ample warning of any potential closures. "SunRail's first priority is safety of our passengers and our rails, so we will make every effort to inform passengers through traditional and social media, SunRail. com and our transit partners, LYNX and Votran," said Steve Olson, Communications Manager for the East-Central Florida Region / District 5 of the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).

SunRail encourages all passengers to stay alert to hurricane and tropical storm warnings when these storms threaten our state. We at SunRail wish all safe travels.
